INVITING - RETAIL - POCKET PLAZAS LUMPKIN STREET







- Complete Street
- Active ground floor uses front the expanded streetscape featuring gathering spaces and rain gardens
- Stormwater infiltration planters improve water quality and reduce peak discharge from the street
- Triple row of street trees provide more shade and offset the urban heat island effect

GREEN STREETS

CURBLESS PLANTERS - OPEN VIEWS - MULTI-USE - NODES







- Complete Streets Lumpkin St, Madison St, Strong St, College Ave, Hoyt St, and Hull St
- Integrate stormwater management into streets
- Street trees within infiltration planters are present on all streets on a regular spacing
- with generous soil volume and a connected under-drain system

PUBLIC - OPEN LAWNS - ACTIVITIES GREEN SPACES







- Open spaces with hardscape and plantings provide room and amenities for small or large gatherings
- Pedestrian connections are dominant throughout community
- Dedicated space for art display are provided throughout at key vistas
- Neighborhood stories are celebrated with signs and markers

WETLAND PARK

RESTORATIVE - SERENE - TIERED - BIOPHILIA







- Provides short term storage of runoff from the watershed including the quadrangle bound by College Ave, Dougherty Ave, Hoyt St and Hull St
- Deals with flooding and improves runoff water quality going into Pulaski Creek
- Provides usable open space for programming community gathering and activities

LINEAR PARK

CONNECTIVE - ACTIVE - ART - HISTORY







- Shared open space for residents and community provides a pedestrian connection between Lumpkin Street (downtown) and the Stormwater Park connector to Lay Park and the Pulaski Trail
- Terraces provide space for gatherings, art exhibits, historic references, and rain gardens
- Ground level units front the park

RAIN GARDENS


- Improves runoff water quality from roofs and paving
- Offers a seasonally changing plant ecoscape with a high aesthetic value
- Increases biodiversity through a range of native plant habitats












GATHERING SPACES
